[0:00] As promised at this time in the service, we are going to invite Reuben and his mom and dad and godparents to come up here, and we are excited for this baptism and an opportunity to welcome someone into our church family.

Hey there. Dearly beloved, Scripture teaches that we are all dead in our sins and trespasses, but by grace we may be saved through faith.

Our Savior Jesus Christ said, unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God. And he commissioned the church to make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Here we ask our Heavenly Father that this child, being baptized with water, may be filled with the Holy Spirit, born again and received into the church as a living member of Christ's body.

Therefore, I urge you to call upon God the Father through our Lord Jesus Christ, that of His abundant mercy He will grant to this child that which by nature He cannot have. The candidate for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

[1:28] We present Reuben Alistair Stokes. Receive the sacrament of baptism. All right. Today on behalf of this child you shall make vows to renounce the devil and all his works, to trust God wholeheartedly and to serve Him faithfully.

It is your task to see that this child is taught as soon as he is able to learn the meaning of all of these vows and of the faith that you will profess as revealed in the Holy Scriptures.

He must come to put his faith in Jesus Christ and learn the creeds, the Lord's Prayer, and the Ten Commandments, and all other things that a Christian ought to know, believe, and do for the welfare of his soul. When he has embraced all these, he is to come to the bishop to be confirmed that he may publicly claim the faith for his own and be further strengthened by the Holy Spirit to serve Christ and His Bridegroom.

Are you willing and ready to undertake this? I am. The Lord is my helper. Wonderful. So at this time I will ask you to make the renunciations and the affirmations on Reuben's behalf.

Do you renounce the devil and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God? I renounce them. Do you renounce the empty promises and deadly deceits of this world that corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?

[2:46] I renounce them. Do you renounce the sinful desires of the flesh that draw you from the love of God? I renounce them. Almighty God, deliver you from the powers of darkness and evil and lead you into the light and the obedience of the kingdom of His Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

Amen. Amen. Do you turn to Jesus Christ and confess Him as your Lord and Savior? I do. Do you joyfully receive the Christian faith as revealed in the Holy Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments?

I do. Will you obediently keep God's holy will and commandments and walk in them all the days of your life? I will. The Lord be my helper. Wonderful.

Now, congregation, we believe that no one is raised in the faith in a vacuum, and we believe that it is primarily the family, the parents' responsibility, but they don't do it alone, and we actually need the support of a whole community to raise our children in the faith.

And so I'm going to ask you, and if you agree with this, answer we will. Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support this child in his life in Christ?

[4:01] We will. Excellent. Let's join with this child to proclaim our faith in the words of the ancient baptismal confession, the Apostles' Creed. I invite you to stand.

Do you believe and trust in God the Father? I do. I believe in God, Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth. Do you believe and trust in Jesus Christ?

I do. I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried.

He descended to the dead. On the third day, he rose again. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe and trust in the Holy Spirit? I do. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

[5:10] Amen. And let us now pray for this child who is to receive the sacrament of baptism. That this child may come to confess his faith in Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior.

He beseeched you to hear us, dear Lord. That this child may continue in the apostles' teaching and the fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers. He beseeched you to hear us, dear Lord.

That he may walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which he has been called, ever growing in faith and all heavenly virtues. He beseeched you to hear us, dear Lord.

That he may persevere in resisting evil, and whenever he falls into sin, repent and return to the Lord. He beseeched you to hear us, dear Lord.

That he may proclaim by word and deed the good news of God and Christ Jesus to a lost and broken world. He beseeched you to hear us, dear Lord.

That as a living member of the body of Christ, he may grow up in every way, and to him who is the head. He beseeched you to hear us, dear Lord. That looking to Jesus, he may run with endurance the race set before him, and at the last, receive the unfading crown of glory.

He beseeched you to hear us, dear Lord. Let us pray. Almighty and everlasting Father, in your great mercy you saved Noah and his family in the ark from the destruction of the flood, prefiguring the sacrament of holy baptism.

Look mercifully upon this, your servant. Wash and sanctify him through our Holy Spirit, that he may be delivered from destruction and received into the ark of Christ's church. And being steadfast in faith, joyful through hope, and rooted in love, he may pass through the turbulent floods of this troublesome world, and come into the land of everlasting life.

Through Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen. The Lord be with you.

And also with you. Lift up your hearts. Lift up your hearts to the Lord. Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give him thanks and praise. We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water.

Over it, the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through it, you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In it, your son Jesus received the baptism of John in the river Jordan, and the Holy Spirit descended upon him as a dove.

We thank you, Father, for the water of baptism. In it, we are buried with Christ in his death. By it, we share in his resurrection. Through it, we are made regenerate by the Holy Spirit.

Therefore, in joyful obedience to your son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Now, Father, sanctify this water by the power of your Holy Spirit. May all who are baptized here be cleansed from sin, be born again, and continue forever faithful in the risen life of Jesus Christ, our Savior.

To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit be all honor and glory, now and forever. Amen. Amen. I invite you all to step over here, and I am going to take you, cutie.
