[0 : 00] Good evening and welcome to Braymar. We're so glad you could join us for our Christmas Eve service. This is a safe place, a place for you to be welcomed as you are, treated with kindness and acceptance, and invited in as part of the family. In these times of uncertainty and anxiety, we all need to be reminded of truth and hope. We need to be reminded of the things that we can trust.

Every Sunday in the Advent season, the four weeks leading up to Christmas, we light the candles of the Advent wreath. These four candles represent the four virtues Jesus brings us. Hope, love, joy, and peace.

And on Christmas Eve, we light a larger white candle in the center, which is called the Christ candle. This Christ candle reminds us that our time of waiting has become a time of welcome. Our time of anticipation has become a time of celebration. In light of a present and future that, at least for now, seems to be changing like shifting sand, we need to be reminded of a story that never changes and the hope that story can bring to our lives.

That is the story of the birth of Jesus Christ and the true meaning of Christmas. So tonight, we gather here to listen to the words of that story from the Bible and from the well-known Christmas carols.

[1 : 32] The prophet Isaiah heralded the coming of the Messiah in Isaiah chapter 7, verse 14, when he wrote, The people of Israel longed for a deliverer, and prophecies foretold that he would come.

O come, O come, O come, Emmanuel, Rejoice, rejoice, rejoice, Emmanuel, Emmanuel, shall come to thee, O Israel.
