## Spiritual Schizophrenia (Bilingual)

Of course, we do not change our skin colour. Rather, we change our behaviour in accordance with our environment.

[1:27] In the Bible passage today, Paul talks about an event in which Peter became a chameleon, and then he was rebuked by Paul.

This is a thing that happened when Peter went to the church in Antioch. In the Bible passage, it tells us that Peter went to the church in Antioch.

When Peter went to Antioch, he and the people of Antioch, he ate with the Gentiles. In verse 12, it tells us that when Peter arrived at Antioch, he ate with the Gentiles.
