What? What does it mean for God to visit? In Genesis chapter 50, verse 24 and 25. Joseph said, I'm dying.

I'm dying. I'm dying. But God will surely live. And Joseph said to his brothers, brothers. I am dying. But God will surely visit you. Hallelujah.

Hallelujah. If it sounds like you just say, that's me. That's me. He said, I'm dying. I'm dying. But God will surely visit you and bring you out of this land to the land which he swore to Abraham, to Isaac, and Jacob.

God is going to fulfill his word. But for him to fulfill his word, he has to visit you. Amen. He has to come upon you. Visit.

Not concordance. Sorry. Yeah. Concordance with the strong. The English. So Hebrew and the Greek. It will tell you that the Greek word translated visit sounds like.

That's it. Episcopemia. You see. There's a root word and a prefix. Hold. Join hands. This is one word.

[6:00] Episcopemia. Okay. Now. You start writing. Episcopemia. So when you separate. This is epi. And scopemia. So this is the prefix. It always comes.

So it's like. Probation. What's probation? Pro and ambition. So if you want to understand probation.

You have to look for the meaning of ambition. And then before. You understand that? Yeah. So there are a lot of English words like that too. The prefix.

And the root word. Now. So. Which one is the root word? Yeah. So in the case of Episcopemia. Which one is it? Scopemia.

Scopemia. So. Skepto. Sorry. So Episcopemia. Rather. Sorry. No scoping. Skeptomia. It's like skeptic. That's where you get the word skeptic from.

Is not a proper hope. Your faith must have a reason. I'm making you think.

Why do you believe in Jesus? I don't know. They say we should believe. That you are not saved. I'm telling you. You are not saved. The saving faith. Has reason.

Reason. Reason does not save. But the faith that saves. Has reason. It says that.

Be prepared to give. A reason. For the hope that is in you. First Peter chapter 3 verse. 16. I think 15 or 16. 15.

It is. Either. You don't know. There is a reason. You haven't identified. Or you are not saved. Because you must know. So. So. The.

In the. As I. As I said. There is. The oversight. Overseer. Um. Which is. The bishop. Overseer.

And I told you. How vision. And visit. Are from the same root word. And. One word that. You. I can't go without. Letting you know. Is.

The needed. Lamp. That's the main object. But you need the fire. To burn it. So that. It's not out of your control. It's not in the hands of God. So he said.

Father. The. The. The fire. And the wood. But. But. Where is the lamb? Because. A lamb is needed. Then look at the next verse.

[18:25] Let's all read the next verse together. Read it out loud. And Abraham said. I saw. All the provide. So. The lamb. To the children.

The lamb. The lamb. Ah. Did you see that word there? God will. Provide. God. So. That word. God will provide.

In the original. Hebrew. Is. Jehovah. Jehovah. Jehovah. Jehovah. Jehovah was translated in English. As God. Will provide.

But. It is one word. Jehovah. Jehovah. Jehovah. That's where do. The word. Jehovah comes from. Provider. Now. So having said that. What will God do?

Professional. Confession. Fashion. Pro. All those things. English, I told you, is just a combination of. So, pro-vite. Pro-vite.

Or pro-vision. Pro-vision has to do with. What's pro? Before. Yeah, pro is like before. Pro. You know, pro is before.

So, uh. Pro. Almost like pre. So, pro-vision. All for. Pro is for. So, pro-vision is God.

[20:28] If you say God will provide, that means God will see ahead. Vision. Does that ring a bell?

Pro-vidence. Pro-vidence. Pro-vidence. Pro-vidence. And he said, this is providence. Pro-vidence. It's like God already knew what was going to happen. How come the day you sat on the bus, the very person you sat on was looking for somebody like you to hire for a big international.

[21:30] It was like divine providence. How come you ended up in that school? Because if you had not gone to that school, you would have not met that professor who liked you so much and helped you to become.

And it looks like you are now working in destiny. Oh, this is pro. So, now, what I want you to understand is when God visits you, he doesn't just come to see.

But, now, provision is not knowing ahead. Not just God knows ahead. Okay. To have providence also means that God has actually made available for what has to be done.

And that is why God visited Sarah. So, God's visitation comes with provision. Divine visitation comes with divine providence.

Providence. Someone say providence. Oh, so when we are praying that God visits us, what you are saying is, God, come, look on my case. And do it as you have already planned.

[22:46] Do it. So, that's why Abraham told Isaac God will provide. God will pro. See. He will see to it that everything will go the way it must go according to his plan.
