You've taken care of us since we came out of the womb. O Lord, what reason we have to bow humbly before you and worship you, but become gracious God before you as one who is full of steadfast love.

You never begin to love eternally and stop. O Lord, we thank you, even our sin cannot stop you loving your people.

And so we bow before you and thank you. We worship you and praise you for your great grace. O Heavenly Father, you are worthy.

You are worthy to be praised. We come, Lord, humbly, remembering we brought the curse on the universe.

We remember we have despised and rejected overtures of mercy. We come, Lord, remembering that we've done our own thing.

We've pleased ourselves instead of our maker. Lord, we acknowledge that we are more guilty than the heathen.

For the heathen have never heard of your glory. The heathen have never heard of your mercy. The heathen have never had the overtures of mercy which we've had.

Thank you, Heavenly Father, for not instantly abandoning us. Thank you, Heavenly Father, for giving us your word.

Thank you, Heavenly Father, for giving us promises. Thank you for giving us the gospel. Thank you for giving us hope.

Thank you for your love. Thank you for your Holy Spirit who is present. But thank you most of all for giving your son.

Giving him up to the horrors and agonies of Calvary. A cruel cross having first been scourged and beaten.

[7:27] And then the horrific death of the cross. You gave him up to that for us. Oh, Lord, we would bow and worship you and thank you.

We ask, oh, Lord, that your spirit would move amongst us. Bless us. Revive us. Keep us. Challenge us.

Stir us up. Oh, Lord, you know how flat we are. How dead we are. Stir us up. Revive us again, oh, holy God.

We humbly pray. We ask, gracious God, that you would bless us as a congregation of your people. Bless this congregation with a pastor that loves you and serves you.

And one who will teach them and bless them out of your word. One who will be accompanied by your Holy Spirit. We pray, Heavenly Father, that you would bless every congregation of your church and your people.

As we noted in the morning, this is Christ's last private talk with his disciples before he went out to suffer. And they're very confused with what he had to say. And they're very discouraged. But Jesus emphasizes at the very beginning in verse 1, these things have I spoken unto you, that you should not be offended. And as most of you will know, the translation of the word offended can be and is translated, that you should not stumble. He's telling them this, that they would not stumble. He's saying in these verses, these things I have spoken unto you, that you might have peace. And they don't. They don't have peace.

But he said it to them, that they would have peace. He told them Peter was going to deny them. He told them there was a mole in the camp that was going to betray them. He told them, I'm going to leave you. And they were unnerved. And yet, he tells them twice in this chapter, I'm telling you these things Christ's intention. And it always is his intention. When he says something, when he does something, his only purpose is to strengthen and prepare and encourage these people. Christ has never and will never say anything to discourage anyone. And if we find something, he says discouraging, we have not understood it properly. We need to pray to God to open our understanding and grasp it.

Christ's basic message here is, the Christian life is not easy. But still be encouraged.

Don't let anyone tell you it's easy to be a Christian. It's glorious to be a Christian. It's glorious. There's a wonderful future. But it's not easy. It's hard. Let's look precisely, and as best we can, at what he's saying to them. In the world, you will have tribulation. Now, when he said that to them, he did not mean, you're going to have problems now and again in the world. That's not actually what he's saying when he says, in the world, you'll have tribulation. In fact, the word tribulation, if I remember correctly, could be translated, in the world, you'll be under pressure.

What he's saying here is not that you'll have problems now and again in the world, but that the whole world system is opposed to Christian teaching. He's saying the mindset of this world is designed to make it difficult for the Christian to live a godly life. It will be difficult to follow me closely. It doesn't come easily, but be of good cheer. You see, the way the world operates is now out of sync with Christian thinking, Christian teaching, and Christian practice. The way the world operates is now out of sync. You see, when God created the world, he created the laws of nature, to put it some way, one way, one way. The law he created. In other words, he wired the world a certain way. But the moment sin entered into the world, that moment, there was a disjunction. A disjunction took place in the whole universe. And now, the world is not wired to make it conducive to Christian living. In the world, you'll be under pressure. In the world, it will not be easy to live the Christian life. In the world, you will have tribulation. The problems that Christians will experience in the world are not hiccups now and again. They'll actually be routine. But be of good cheer. Nevertheless, be of good cheer. I have overcome the world.

Christ has defeated and overcome the world's system, the world's mindset, the world's way of working.

[31 : 25] Christ has defeated and overcome the world's way of working. Do not go with the flow. Instead, swim against the tide and meet Christ at the other side. That's his advice. Don't go with the flow. Swim against the tide and meet me in glory.

In the world, you'll be under prayer. In the world, you'll be under prayer. But be of good cheer. In me, these things I've spoken to you, that in me, you might have peace.

I'm sure I've said here before, the Bible hardly ever uses the term Christian. It's only three times in the Bible. The word Christian is only in the Bible, or at least only in the authorised version, three times.

The word the Bible uses for what we would call Christian is only in Christ. That's the most popular term, the most common term in the Bible for a Christian.

If any man be in Christ, he's a new creation. And here he is saying, in me, you will have peace. In this turbulent, stormy, under-pressure world, in me, you will have peace.

[33:06] Now, I've never been in a submarine. But they tell me that a submarine is not subject to storms, like ships.

In a submarine, you're sailing above the sea, on the water. In a submarine, you're underneath it all. And you've got peace.

You're not conscious of a storm in a submarine, the way you are in a ship. And it's something like that, that Christ is saying, look, in me, the storms above will not have the same effect upon you.

In me, you can have peace. We've often said here, I'm sure, peace in the Bible is not absence of trouble.

It's not absence from problems. The peace of God in the Bible is peace while trouble is going on all around you.

[34:17] But in Christ, you can have peace. Things are falling apart all around you. But the Christian can still have peace in Christ.

Be of good cheer is also a scripture in Matthew 14, 27.

When he says, be of good cheer, it is I, be not afraid. Storms. Storms. And they see Christ walking on the water and they're afraid.

They're afraid. It is I, be not afraid. The literal translation would be, is, take courage.

I am. Storms disturb us. Bad news suddenly shakes us.

[35:23] It doesn't disturb, it doesn't cause a ripple in heaven. Take courage. Take courage. I am. That is what Christ is saying to every Christian when things go so wrong according to the way we think here on earth.

I am. Christ is our peace if we're Christians. To know Christ strengthens.

To know Christ encourages. To know Christ builds one up in the faith. To know Christ stimulates the Christian.

Revives the Christian. Makes them alive. And that can happen in the greatest storms of life. In me you shall have peace.

In the world you'll have tribulation. But be of good cheer. I am greater than the world. I have overcome the world.

[36:41] I am. Be encouraged. Take courage. I am. Be of good cheer.

And on his word. You remember. When he met Zacchaeus. Hiding up in the tree. Nobody knew he was there. But Christ knew he was there.

[45:24] And he said. Today. Today. I must abide in your house. And he went along. And had a dinner. With him. How did he know that?

How did he know. That he was hiding up in the tree? How did he know. His duty. Was to go to. Zacchaeus' house. And have a dinner. With him. His mind.

Was fixed. On God. Do you remember. In John chapter 4. Looking at the woman of Samaria. We noted. The Bible said. He must.

Well he hasn't got to go that way. It's not the obvious. A shorter way there. Why did he go the long way? How did he know? He knew he had to meet the woman that day. How did he know?

Romans chapter 5. The apostle tells us. Having been. Being justified by faith. We have peace with God.

You'll never have peace with God. You'll never have peace. Until you faith. In God. Have you not noticed.

[48:23] Various generations. Various societies. A faithless age. Is a restless age.

You cannot have rest. If you don't have faith. Faith. I mean. It's so fundamental. And basic. To life. You go. And you sit. In a chair.

For living. It's a basic. For. I go to live in my house. I have no peace. If I think. The host is going to come in. You can't live without faith. It's essential.

And it's special. It's the only way. To get right with God. Have faith in God. But you not only cannot have peace.

[49:20] Without faith. You can't have peace. Without love. Faith. And love. Are. The theologians call them.

The inseparable twins. If you have one. You've got the other. It's a good. Way to test. It's a good. Mark of grace. Do you wonder.

Is your faith. Really in Christ. Well ask yourself. Do you love Christ. And if you can honestly say. You love Christ. Your faith.

Is in Christ. And if you want to know. Do you love Christ. You ask yourself. Well. Do I trust him. Do I believe what he says. Is true. Well if you do.

You love him. Faith and love. Are the two sides. Of one coin. If you've got one. You've got the other. Do you want the peace.
