[0:00] Good evening, brothers, sisters and friends, a joy to worship the Lord as we begin our communion weekend. Three intimations, first of all, of course, concerning the funeral tomorrow morning, God willing, 10.30 here.

So 10.30 the funeral tomorrow. Please do pass that information along to anyone who you think may be wishing to attend. It's quite an early one, I know, compared to our usual, but 10.30 tomorrow morning, all being well.

I've also heard in passing there's some fellowships being planned. Now, just because I announce them doesn't mean I'm promoting them or not promoting them, but it's good to know who has what.

I know that tonight for definite. Margaret is having a fellowship in her house tonight. And then, God willing, tomorrow night, we'll be one in the manse.

So Margaret's having one tonight, and in the manse tomorrow night. And you know yourselves, please do attend these fellowships if you can. It's good to spend time together as brothers and sisters informally.

[1:09] And, of course, I have a conclusion. The session will meet and will be opened. And that's as open then for the weekend. And, please do, dear brother or dear sister, if you are intending on coming forward and proclaiming Christ publicly as your saviour and friend and king, please don't waste too much time.

We're open tonight. We'll be here tonight. Here tomorrow night. Saturday night. And apart from that, again, I know we say it often, but we mean it.

And our houses, the elders, are open. The manse is certainly open. Our phones are on. Whether it's 10 o'clock at night or 10 in the morning, 1 in the morning, come, knock our doors and say, I want to go forward.

And we will make that correct session happen immediately. Please don't miss another communion season. We'll be singing this evening to God's praise.

Let's worship the Lord. We can sing through a section of Psalm 45, the second version of the Psalm, Scottish Psalter. Psalm 45, the second version.

[6:43] We ask that your word would speak to us this evening. It would encourage us. It would challenge us. We often admit that we are confronted by your word.

As your word tells us one way of being or thinking or living. And we find that measuring up to ourselves. And we find ourselves measuring so poorly.

Help us then to be willing to listen to your word. Help us to be willing to place your word over our lives. And to measure our lives.

And to guide our lives by the living word. Thank you Lord for everyone here this evening. We thank you for those here just now who are yours. Who know you and who love you.

We ask as we spend time together as a church. As brothers and sisters. As a family here. As a gathering of your people. We would leave this place tonight. Not just having grown in some facts.

[7:41] Or having grown in pure knowledge. But we would leave this place tonight. Having grown in our knowledge yes. But then therefore having grown in our love and worship.

And therefore having grown in our service towards you. We would leave this place tonight filled with awe and wonder. And thankfulness at who you are. And what you have done.

The provision you have made through the only glorious. Eternal Son. The Lord Jesus Christ. Help us this weekend.

Pray just now for any who will join us this weekend. Friends and brothers and sisters from other congregations. That they would feel welcome in our midst. That they also would enjoy times of fellowship.

And times of togetherness. Both in our services. But also behind the scenes and private in our homes. For this weekend we will be known for being a weekend where your name was praised.

[8:40] Your name was honoured. Where Christ was remembered. In his person. In his work. But also we remember the fact we worship a living saviour.

Although we will soon join together in a few days to think back to what he has done for us. To think back to that dark night of horror.

To think back to the destruction of the body. The becoming of full sin. Of the one who was sinless. The pain and agony and anxiety and misery.

And sorrow. Of the spotless lamb of God. We also think this weekend forward. That he did not remain in the tomb.

We worship a saviour who is not dead. But one who died and who rose again. Who ascended to your right hand. Who is there just now in a place of victory.

Perhaps in our minds. Of. Why we should not be at the table. For some here. Those of us who. Know you. Who love you. But. Who perhaps see.

In ourselves. So little growth. This past year. Who see in ourselves. So little care. So little warmth. In our hearts. This past year.

We would be honest with you. This evening. And bring these concerns to you. And say that we. Are not perfect. But our efforts. Our strivings.

[11:34] Are not perfect. Our walk. Has not been perfect. But we come. Trusting. And relying. And fully holding on. To a saviour. Who is perfect.

In all his ways. In all that he has done. Who bids us to come. And to dine with him. To sit alongside him. Not because of who we are.

But because of who he is. We pray that would be known. Especially this evening. To any brothers or sisters. Who as of yet. Haven't made that public step.

Brothers and sisters. Who we know. And who we know. That you know. We do ask. That they would. See their place at the table.

Not as a measure. Of their godliness. Or their holiness. Not as a measure. Of their goodness. Not as a measure. Of their perfection. But as a measure.

And that they are his. Help us this evening. Thank you again. This weekend. For those. Who will lead the. Singing of your word. Those who will lead. The public praise. We ask you Lord.

For strength. For them. And we thank you for them. Pray just now. For those. Who will. Work. As we're behind the scenes. Those. Hosting fellowships. And those working.

To look after our visitors. We're also mindful. This evening. Especially. Of what must take place. Tomorrow morning. If it's your will. And plan. We do pray just now. For a morning family.
