[4:41] Be bossy. Just this week, Aaron took me to the airport. And I'm bossing him around. I'm like, what about some car lengths in between these guys?

And he said, Mom, you see that button right over there? I said, yes. Yes, I see it. He said, that's the eject button. He said, if you need to, you know, if I don't want you to say something, I can just eject you right out of there.

We both laughed. It was funny. I couldn't help but share that. But I wish I could be more polished like you, Chris. And so anyway, I'm not too polished today because, like I said, I got a little horrified.

I saw these index cards. I could just see myself dropping all of them. And so I scrambled around, pulled some more notes, and I am very confused. But I'm going to try my best to give you some word out of them.

Okay. So John 1 is 17. Y'all want to look at that scripture? For the law was given by Moses, but grace and truth came by Jesus Christ.

[6:02] Thank God for grace and truth, right? We got to have that. And they worked together, both of them. Coincide together.

But because I say that, because we all offend. We all offend in word. And, you know, that's scripture as well.

So what we want to do is try not to offend as much, you know. Try to walk in love. Is that not right? I had a little poor grandmother.

She didn't have anything to leave me. But I found this little sign. It was a little sign. It was a little sign. And it said, walk in love. And I held on to that.

And I thought, that's more precious than riches in gold. Yes, it is. Praise God. So, again, you know, we are just a hot mess.

[7:03] We mess up. We say things. People, you know, braggy, braggers, talkers. But we got to know when to shut up. We got to know when to hold our tongue.

You know, let people give their opinions. Let people give their answers. But you don't always have to join in and give your story. You know, a guy might catch their, you know, he always wants to meet one up on you.

You know what I mean? I always want to one up and have a greater story. Like you caught one fish, he caught three. You got one tooth pulled, he got three tooth.

I mean, that's not what I had in my notes. But anyway. Great God. All right. So, Proverbs 12 and 6 says, A fool's wrath is presently known, but a prudent, a wise, covereth his shame.

He overlooks an insult. How many of us can overlook an insult? Can you raise your hand? Okay. Mature people in here. I see some perfect people.

[8:17] I love that. I want to be perfect too, but whatever. A fool is quick-tempered, but a wise stay calm when insulted.

Yes, they do. Job, his final words was, My lips will not say anything wicked, and my tongue will not lie. You know, I spoke of lying.

They say that's very common. My tongue will not lie. So, regardless of how great or small, all the same, you can distort the truth.

You can add to it. You can exaggerate. But God wants inwardly what's outwardly. And he wants the truth in the inward parts, in the outward parts.

[9:36] You know? So, God forbid we could just work on that. Work on this little tongue of ours. The smallest member that caused a great deal of stress. It causes the ships to turn around.

That small little, whatever it is. And, you know, it's just important that we work on our mouths. Hold our tongues. Just shut up. Like I said, when you need to shut up, shut up.

Or make yourself shut up. Psalms 51 and 6. Let's look at that, please. Behold, Psalms 51 and 6.

Behold, thou desirest truth in the inward parts. And in the hidden parts, thou shalt make me to know wisdom. Man, oh man. That's some powerful scripture right there.

Make me to know wisdom. The beginning of fear is wisdom of God. That's what the word says. The beginning of fear is the wisdom of God. We fear God.

[10:49] I fear God. I don't know what the future holds. But I do know who holds my hand. Our ways are not his ways.

His ways are mysterious. We don't know why things, some get healed and some don't get healed. But eventually, if you trust in Christ, he's provided an eternal life.

Oh, yes, he has. So, moving on. So, I'm going to get a little serious again, go back to the lies.

Revelations 21 and 8. All liars shall have their part in lake, which burns with fire and brimstone.

Some people, again, I'm scrambled this morning. Some people, their lying is so good they can't tell the truth from the life, from the real deal.

[12:00] They fib, they fabricate, just to make it happen for them, whatever's convenient for them, you know. So, I'm bidding you, and I really think that we should utmost want to respect the dignity of Christ and what he would want us to do.

And just try with all your heart to not fabricate or, you know, tell lies. God's advice, a good advice, is Proverbs 75 and 5.

Y'all want to look at that, please? Proverbs 75 and 5. See my Bible somewhere.

Y'all sure are serious this morning. Is it me? I don't mean to put a damper on anything. 75 and 5.

Lift not up your horn on high. Speak not with a stiff neck. Wow. Don't be the one that toots your own horn. Is that not right?

[13:29] That goes back to the braggers, guys. So, I mean, yeah, yeah, yeah. We just got to speak truth, right? It all goes back to truth.

Truth. God is all truth. He is the all truth. All truth. So, call it integrity.

Call it honesty. Lord wants truth outwardly and inwardly. Regardless of how great or small, all is the same, distorting the truth and the lie.

So, I'm going to move right on. Sorry, guys.

Getting back to... It's okay, darling. It's okay. My daughter, she has her master's.

[14:31] She said, Mom, you want me to proofread your notes? You want me to write them? I said, I'll be okay. This morning when I woke up, I had all this. Man, I got the fear of God in me.

Here I am. So, here it is, Lord. Take me, Lord. Okay. Okay. Oh, Lord Jesus.

Will y'all pray with me right now? I love y'all. Thank you. Thank you. Thank you.

I really want to do good for the Lord. And I guess I'm just a little tired. It's been a long week. Just got in from Colorado. And I really did look at the word while I was there.

And I thought he'd help me this morning. Lord, you're going to help me, right? Right. Building others up or tearing others down.

[15:35] Is that what we do? Do we do that, guys? Let me hear you. Thank you. We edify or we destroy. And you know what?

Jesus had something to say about this. And let's look at it. He said in Luke 6 and 45. Let's look at that. Oh, man, this is really good.

If Jesus said it, I'll take it to the bank. Yeah. Yep. Luke 6 and 45.

[16:42] So you usually can understand people. Not that you want to be judgmental. But God wants us to be able to judge others.

I don't really advocate being a judge. I mean, God is the final judge. He's the final judge. So we want to become more like Christ, don't we?

You know, at the point that we can try to be like Christ.

And then sometimes we get lukewarm. And I know that's not what Christ wants. He wants us to be fervent in prayer. And lots of times when we try our best and we fail, we feel like copping out or just cooling down on our faith.

[17:54] And that's not what we should do, right? We should not cool down on our faith. We shouldn't be half-hearted. Jesus.

Jesus. So, I want to give you a challenge. It's a test. And it's in my notes.

But we're, God only knows. But I can tell you what I did right, or at least from my memory, if it serves me correctly. So, examine my heart, God.

Is that not our test? Examine our heart. And find with me a clean spirit. You know, to the pure, all things are pure.

But our hearts sometimes just don't get it. You know, your mind don't. Unfortunately, our heart and our mind, God really don't make it that clear.

You know, we are body. We're just cold. And that's our thinking process. And we, that doesn't get saved. I hate to bust your bubble, but your mind does not get saved.

And that's where we renew it daily. It don't seem fair. Two to one. Your body, your spirit, and your soul.

Two against one. You know, you're, so I just, I'm not complaining. Thank you, Lord, for salvation. Thank you, Lord.

[21:09] Examine us if we're angry, rude, lewd, and immoral. You know, that's what, again, we need to be kind and try not to be that.

You know, that's where we're taking the test. Because your reputation is what others think of you. But your character is what you really are.

I mean, you can put up a good side. Like I said earlier, I'd kind of jump the gun on all that. But it's what you really are that the Lord sees. Amen. So your words reveal your character.

How awesome is that? You can actually see in the heart of a man by the words that proceed outwardly. Yes, yes, yes, yes.

You build character, guys, when you're dealing with others. How many times do you not want to deal with people? Because it's cutting the sharp edges off of you.

[22:13] And they say, you know, when you see something, this is not in my notes. When you see something in others, it's because it's a mirror looking back at you. It's true.

I believe that. So, again, we want to be a fruit inspector and we want to judge everybody. Hallelujah. And again, out of the abundance of the heart, the mouth speaks.

And the abundance is the overflow. It's the overflow. I see my sister and brother-in-law back there. Y'all surprised me today. I'm very not polished today, but do I have to be?

Thank you. Thank you. Just a hot mess. Thank you. I'm not going to keep y'all very long. Maybe a little early.

Pastor Caleb, you got anything prepared? Hallelujah. Hallelujah. Praise God.

[23:33] Jesus said a man brings good things out of the good treasure of his heart. And I believe that. I believe that out of the good treasure of our heart.

And that's the secret places. The secret. Treasure. If you've got a treasure, don't you usually like to keep it secret? Yeah. Yeah. So, I believe that we should just allow God's work to go in and just to filter out.

Clean within me a clean heart, Lord. Make within me a clean heart. I believe that. I see Pastor Landon. You're always so great and polished.

I love that. And next time I will be. Praise God. But at the point where we get a pop test, we can see deep into the recess of our hearts.

When things aren't going well, that's when things come along for our raw emotions. You know, to flare up on you. And how do you respond? How do you respond when something's rubbed you the wrong way?

[24:48] And what declares your heart's condition? Does the word influence you? Or are you selfish and untamed and unfocused? And that's where it's just raw.

It's just rough and raw. Your conditioning of your heart can be ugly. You can have an ugly spirit. Has anybody ever been told they have an ugly spirit? That can hurt to the bone.

We don't want an ugly spirit, do we? I'm going to seek the face of God. I just want him to be pleased with all of us. Yes. So when our, again, when somebody insults us, our insults, so when our character is assaulted or anything like that, let us rise above it like an eagle, spread our wings above the storm and rise above.

Let the winds of the Holy Ghost just carry us up a little higher. Set free. I believe this for us. I believe that we can do that. We can just rise above the storm when people are insulting us or when things aren't going our way.

We can just rise above with the Holy Ghost, the winds of the Spirit. We'll mount up our wings as an eagle. Is that not right? So thank you.

[26:16] Thank you. I want to get in your business. You know, Proverbs 12 and 16. Y'all want to look at that? Since I got just a little bit of time, I'm kind of rushing through.

That's just who I am. I need to slow down. Proverbs 12 and 16. A fool's wrath is presently known, but a wise man cover his shame.

And I think we already rushed through that, but honestly, love covers a multitude of sins. So really what we should do is, you know, I really want to do research on that.

Does that mean that we let people get away with stuff? Have y'all thought about that? I'm going to look that up. Hey, Pastor Kent, not a time to ask you right now, but I wondered about that.

You know, the word of God is for reproof and direction. And I think that's our job.

[27:38] Praise God. Let people know that God loves them, but he don't love their sin. But, you know, sometimes you just got to calm down and recognize a quick-tempered fool.

Sounds ugly, doesn't it? Fool. That's what the Bible calls it. They got to simmer. Just tell them, simmer your bimmer. So I named several things for our pop test, you know, because we are going to be examined by God.

Hopefully not by each other. You know, not to a point that you, because you have a beam, has a beam in somebody else's eye, you have a beam in your eye, you know, a speck in their eye or something like that.

So, Jesus. So, watch this. Isaiah 57 and 19. Look at that. I create the fruit of thy lips.

I create the fruit of the lips. Peace, peace to him that is far away, that is far off, and to him that is near, saith the Lord. And I will heal him.

[29:21] So, who does the creating? God does. God creates. He gives us the fruit of our lips.

You want to be happy? You want to be happy? Do y'all want to be happy? Thank you. God gives us the fruit of our lips.

The seed of our lips. Hallelujah. And really, you know what the Bible says the fruit of our lips is? It's a praise.

A sacrifice of praise. How can you be sad if you have a praise to God? How can you be sad when you lift up a praise?

Yes. Ooh. Ooh, ooh, ooh. That really just gets me to cold chill in there. It really does. The fruit of our lips is the seed.

Thank you for being here. You're rescuing me. Praise God. Praise God. So set free. Are we going to release ourself? Are we going to release the wings of the Holy Spirit and let him comfort us and protect us and guide us and lead us?

We're going to be a gathering of the eagles. Okay, set free. We're going to be a gathering. You guys, go ahead. Go. Go. Just do it. Go ahead. I just want to speak the name of Jesus.
