Yes it was wonderful but think of all the years and opportunities he had wasted, living without the Lord Jesus, living only for himself. That old man's story is not unique.

Too often so many people hear the gospel, are challenged by it, maybe become convicted of their sin and their need for salvation, but let these opportunities pass them by and they remain unsaved.

And so often when eventually they are converted, they regret bitterly all the years when they resisted Christ. Years that the locusts have eaten. But God gives wonderful encouragement to someone like that.

God says to them, as he did to Israel a long time ago, I will repay you for the years the locusts have eaten, those wasted years. God will give such a person work to do no matter how long they have rejected God's grace, even if they are 100 years old.

While many people come to God while they are still young, yet some of the finest Christians I know were converted later in life and live for Jesus in such a useful way, making up for the years they had lost.
