The 26th of June, Jesus' First Miracle The first of his signs, miracles, Jesus did at Cana in Galilee, and manifested his glory, and his disciples believed in him. The miracle had three effects. Firstly, it saved the host of the wedding feast a great embarrassment. Secondly, the miracle confirmed to Jesus' disciples that Jesus really was who he said he was, the Son of Man, which was a way of saying he was the Son of God.

And the third thing, always what the signs and miracles pointed to, was the glory of heaven that truly belonged to Jesus. And a prayer. Dear Lord Jesus, I pray that I may rejoice in the glory of who you are. Amen.
