But if you look at the last two verses of the psalm, you find David has changed his tune. His troubles have not gone away. There are always troubles and difficulties to be faced. God has changed.

[1 : 04] He remembers the relationship he has with God, and God's unchanging love for him, and the salvation God has given him, and just how good God has been to him in so many ways. So what does he do?

He says, I will sing to the Lord. Yes, the troubles are still there, but David's focus is not now on them, but on God, who is with him in the troubles.

There is a good lesson there for you and me. And a prayer. Dear Lord, I can be so impatient with you. Forgive me and help me to focus on you, and not on my wants.
