The Old Testament mentions trumpeters very often. They were the alarm bells in cities if there was a threat from enemies. They also called men to arms to go and fight.

That, I think, is the reason the Apostle Paul used the trumpet sound when he wrote that the Christian life of the believers in Thessalonica was so true to Christ that people could really hear it and see it.

These were genuine Christian folk, and the sound of their Christian reputation traveled widely. What a wonderful testimony to have, and what a challenge to us if we say that we are Christians.
