Yes, and they are disciplined gently to help them back onto the right road. Like sheep, we can too easily go astray. As the perfect host, God treats us in such a special way that we are filled with wonder that the Lord of heaven should lavish such attention on us.

What does all this mean? It means that for those of us who are Christians, God has a special relationship with us. We are special to him. The almighty, eternal God is a God of tenderness, caring and patient with those who are his children through faith in Jesus.
