They can spread like a fire and cause much hurt and damage. The book of Proverbs is full of advice for us to listen and hear what wise people are saying to us. Listen before we speak.

James says, Let every person be quick to hear, slow to speak, slow to anger. James 1, 19. So, let us hold our tongue until we are sure that what we are saying is true.
