Eli had two sons, both of them priests, but they were really wicked men and had little respect for God and the people. In time, God bypassed the sons of Eli and chose Samuel to serve him as priest and judge in Israel.

Later in the book, we have this said about Samuel. Samuel grew, and the Lord was with him and let none of his words fall to the ground. 1 Samuel 3 verse 19.

[1:15] At the end of his life, he was able to say to the people that he had walked before them as God's true servant from his youth until old age. He was God's faithful servant from the time he was only a boy.

What a wonderful testimony to have. There's a great lesson here for us. The old Sunday school chorus sang, I'm not too young to come to Jesus for he loves a little child.
